

AJARIAN WINE ROUTE

ROUTE STARTING POINT: AJARISTSKALI VILLAGE

ROUTE LENGTH FROM BATUMI TO

AJARISTSKALI – 18 KM

Keda municipality is considered to be a hotbed of Ajarian wine-making. The most famous local wines in Ajara are Tsolikauri and Chkhaveri. Pink dry wine Chkhaveri is distinguished with its tenderness and exceptional taste, while dry white table wine Tsolikauri is made from the Tsolikauri grape variety. There are numerous rural wine cellars in Keda producing delicious wines with a distinct delicacy and aroma.



SIGHTS ON THE ROUTE

ZVARE CHURCH

Zvare St. Giorgi Chapel is one of a few churches in Keda district. The church was built in modern times and is beautifully located on the edge of a cliff right above the Ajaristskali River.



Ajarian wine route offers the possibility to travel through a beautiful landscape of mountainous Keda region sampling locally produced wines.

The route begins in village Ajaristskali, from where it can be continued in 7 directions as described below. No matter which direction you choose, the initial part of the route will go through the same area and on the road you can see the arched stone bridge of Queen Tamar (10) and Makhuntseti waterfall (13), both located in the village Makhuntseti. Near the bridge and next to the waterfall visitors can taste and buy local honey.

THE ARCHED STONE BRIDGE OF DANDALO (12TH CENTURY)



Dandolo Bridge is located in the village of Dandolo, near the Batumi-Akhalsikhe highway. It is built on volcanic lime mortar rock. The piers are erected on a rock, on which scaffold holes have been preserved. The Dandolo arch bridge is one of the best examples of arched bridges in Georgia.

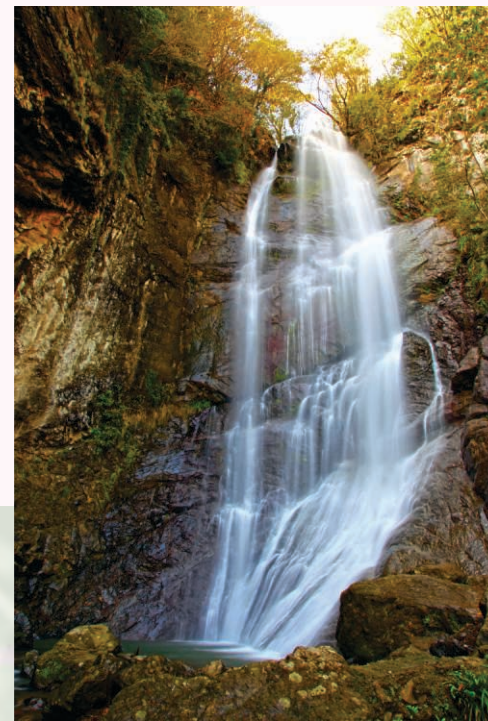

The museums display various aspects of the ethnography and history of Ajara: tools of the trade, the decorative arts collection, old household items and other ethnographical material.

MAKHUNTSETI WATERFALL

Falling from a height of 36 meters, Makhuntseti waterfall is one of the most beautiful and most visited tourist attractions in Ajara. Near the waterfall several picnic sites are available for visitors. While visiting the waterfall it is also possible to visit nearby tourist attractions, including the arched stone bridge of Queen Tamar (10).



ACTIVITIES



While traveling the wine route you can not only explore the world of wine, but find a wide array of alternative options: hiking through vineyards and surrounding area, cookery workshops - making the authentic Ajarian dishes, including pelamushi (dessert made of condensed grape juice and corn flour) and churchkhela (nuts strung on a thread dipped in thickened grape juice), participating in the grape picking (seasonally), acquaintance with unique Ajarian traditions and villagers' life.

MEALS

Ajara has colorful and flavorful cuisine based on unique centuries-old local recipes. Traveling along the Wine Route you will have the opportunity to taste Georgian cuisine in one of the wine cellars or rural restaurants and to prepare one of the authentic Ajarian dishes under the guidance of hostess of a guest house.
